FEBRUARY IN THE GARDEN

This month, by all accounts, has been brutal on our daylilies and other tender perennials. Why? No snow cover, which acts as an excellent insulation for our plants. This said, we will wait to see which ones survive this month's bitter cold days. Last year, for example, crocus were blooming in early February and daffodils were really breaking dormancy. We had 14 days with temperatures below 32° and 6 days OVER 70°! By the end of February, 2017, the early daffodils were blooming. These included Tete-a-Tete and Lemon Silk. In 2016 (2 years ago), we had some good snow fall on Feb. 14 and on Feb. 15, six inches was recorded for Louisville. When Helen and I got to fly to Phoenix on Feb. 17 (to visit our daughter's family), our plane had to be de-iced before take-off. Ice also tends to protect plants. That year (2016) we had 12 days with temperatures below 32°, and 5 days over 60°.

I have seen no crocus blooming the early part of this month, but I am happy to report the daffodils are definitely breaking dormancy, and depending on the variety, have poked up from 1/4th inch to over 6" in some cases. Surely, there will be bloom by the last week to 10 days of February. So keep a look out for daffodils in your beds or neighborhoods.
