September is Here!

What has been typical over the last several years? Well, besides pulling lots of crabgrass and other assorted weeds, often some very hot heat indexes for the first 12 days or so. Toward the end of the month, the weather may be cooler and could be somewhat dry.

September is the time to remove those daylilies still in pots and get them in the ground. This month is considered the ideal planting time, after the extreme heat of the summer months has passed. I have always planted a dozen or more new daylilies during the month of September.

Seed pods are ripening now and should be harvested when they have turned brown and are starting to crack open. Keep watch over these if you want to harvest them, as the pods will spill the seeds onto the ground if you wait too long.

Any proliferations that you have had soaking in water since last month should have some substantial roots by now and could be planted in small pots at this time. Be sure to bring them to the DSL picnic this month if you want to swap them for some new ones you don't have. It looks like I will bring several "prolifs" to the picnic, including "Whatchamacallit", "Ebony Lamanite", "Priscilla's Dream", and "Night Shadz Star". All are quality daylilies and will be wonderful additions to any gardens. The hybridizer of "Whatchamacallit" is Steve Williams of Ohio. He will be our featured speaker next month (October).

That brings us to the Annual DSL Picnic. Traditionally, the 4th Sunday of September is the date for this fun event! DSL has a lot of good cooks and the informal fellowship is the icing on the cake. No doubt the generosity of the membership will be on display with lots of daylily door prizes, too! So, see you all on the 23rd at the Nature Center across from the Louisville Zoo. In the meantime, enjoy the last of the summer blooms in your gardens!
